





'It's a big dog!' the birds shout. They fly away.




The ugly duckling is afraid. He hides in the grass. The big dog runs into the grass. It sees the ugly duckling. It smells the ugly duckling, but it goes away.

'The dog doesn't like me because I'm ugly,' says the ugly duckling.








The ugly duckling eats the food. Now he feels happy.









Now it is autumn. It is cold.

'Hello!' he shouts.










The winter months are long and cold. The ugly duckling is very sad and hungry.

'Those birds are beautiful, but I'm ugly,' says the ugly duckling.








'Hello. I'm ugly, but please be my friends,' he says.

The ugly duckling looks in the water. He sees his face. He is very surprised. He isn't ugly. He is a beautiful white bird! The ugly duckling is a swan!






Three children see the swans.

'Look! Look!' they say. 'There's a new swan. He's very beautiful.'


The new swan is shy. He hides his face under his wing.








The new swan remembers all the sad days, but he isn't angry. Everybody loves the new swan. He has got lots of friends. He is very happy.
